The **Program**: Justin gave a Powerpoint presentation of the Field Day results.

There were 20 participants at the farm this year, including 4 guests. The low turnout is a point of concern to be addressed.

CARC claimed a score of 3988 with 474 CW contacts and 251 via microphone. The QSOs have been submitted to ARRL and are posted on W8AL.org

As usual, the most popular band was 40 meters, scoring 47% of contacts, while 80 meters made a good showing with 23%. There was some discussion of doing a 3A entry in 2024 with a 3rd station running digital.
